About our Sessions and Clinicians...



Mary Beuoy and Jalean Addington will present tips for engaging children in a fun and motivational way during their music instruction. They will include games, activities, dances, movement, and songs that support music standards, reinforce proper technique, and encourage active learning. These activities will be appropriate for student from kindergarten to grade 7. Mary is pictured.

Mary has been a music educator with the Greenfield-Central Community School Corporation for the past 28 years. She holds Bachelor of Science and Master of Arts degrees from Ball State University and was the 2010 recipient of IMEA's outstanding elementary music educator award. Mary lives in Pendleton, Indiana with her husband, two children and an 18 year old mutt named Pepper.

Jalean holds a B.S. in K-12 Choral and General Music Education and M.A. in Early Childhood Education. She has taught 10 years at the middle/high school levels and the remainder at the elementary level. Jalean lives in Greenfield, Indiana with her husband Clint, three children, two dogs, and a lot of flowers.



This participatory workshop, “The World Music Drumming Experience,” will focus on three areas: 1) basics of technique, which will include drumming, adenkum (gourds), and the gyl (xylophone); 2) adaptations of teaching concepts and performance for varying grade levels (primary grades to the secondary classroom), and 3) adaptations for the less equipped classroom/traveling music teacher. This presentation is based on the World Music Drumming (WMD) Curriculum, authored by Will Schmid. Come to drum.....and have FUN!

Dr. Chris Ann Lessly is a Professor of Music and Coordinator of Music Education at Indiana Wesleyan University in Marion, Indiana. She received the Bachelor of Music Education degree from The University of Central Missouri, and the Master of Music Education and Ph.D. degrees from the University of Kansas. She previously taught both choral and instrumental music in the Rolla, Missouri public schools. She has also taught at the University of Montevallo (Alabama), and Luther College (Iowa). She is a member of MENC, IMEA, the National Association of College Wind and Percussion Instructors, and the American Orff-Schulwerk Association. Dr. Lessly has completed Levels I, II, and III of Will Schmid's World Music Drumming Curriculum, which includes seven years of more advanced training in West African drumming from Sowah Mensah and Josh Ryan. She serves on the Society for General Music National Executive Committee. She has presented music education clinics and workshops in Midwestern and Southern states.



"Recorders: A Different Approach" will explore recorder activities that encourage improvisation and composition. Ways to promote good technique will also be covered. The session will include speech, singing, movement, recorders, pitched and unpitched percussion instruments. There will be activities that are appropriate for grades 3-6. Detailed notes will be included! Come prepared to play!

Lisa Sullivan teaches general music at Mohawk Trails Elementary in Carmel, Indiana. She teaches private piano in her home studio as well as being active in the adult and children's music at church. Lisa holds a Bachelor's degree in Music Education from Butler University and a Master's degree in Elementary Administration from Ball State University. Lisa completed three levels in Orff Schulwerk, as well as Orff Curriculum, and Orff Master Class at the University of St. Thomas in St. Paul, Minnesota. Lisa has presented at local chapter meetings of the Indiana Orff Schulwerk Association, National Orff Conferences, as well as State Conferences of the Indiana Music Educators Association. Lisa is currently the course director and teaches Orff Level I at Anderson University in Anderson, Indiana and DePaul University in Chicago.
